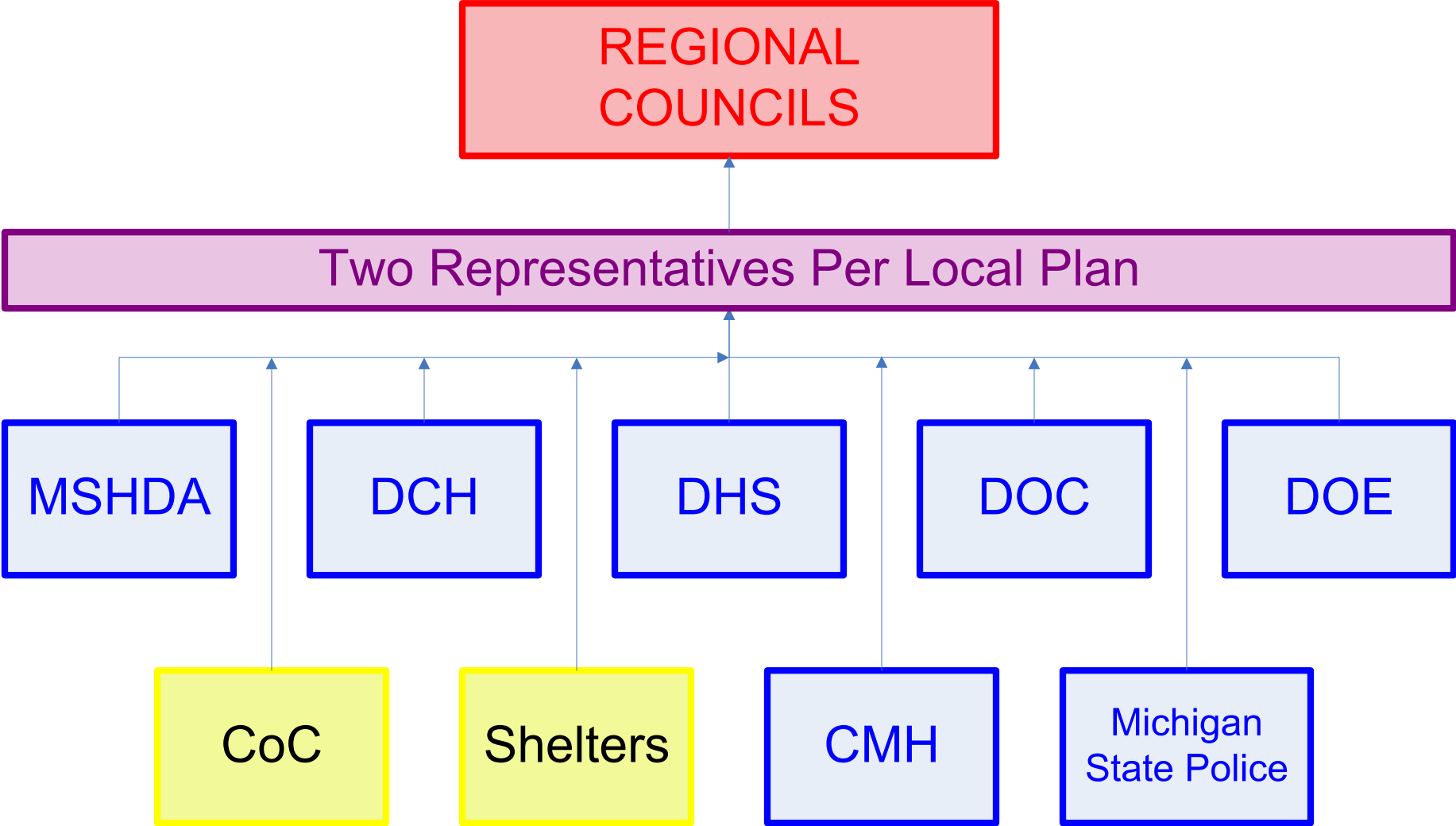

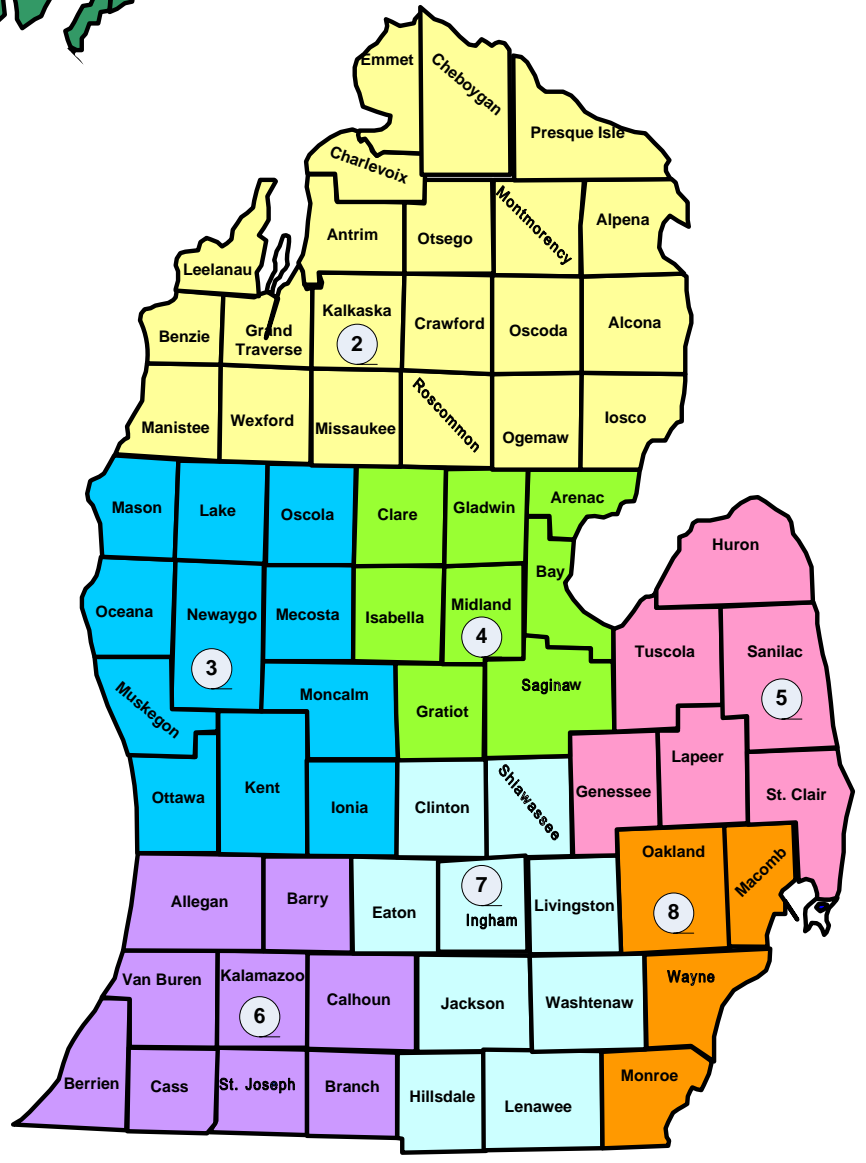
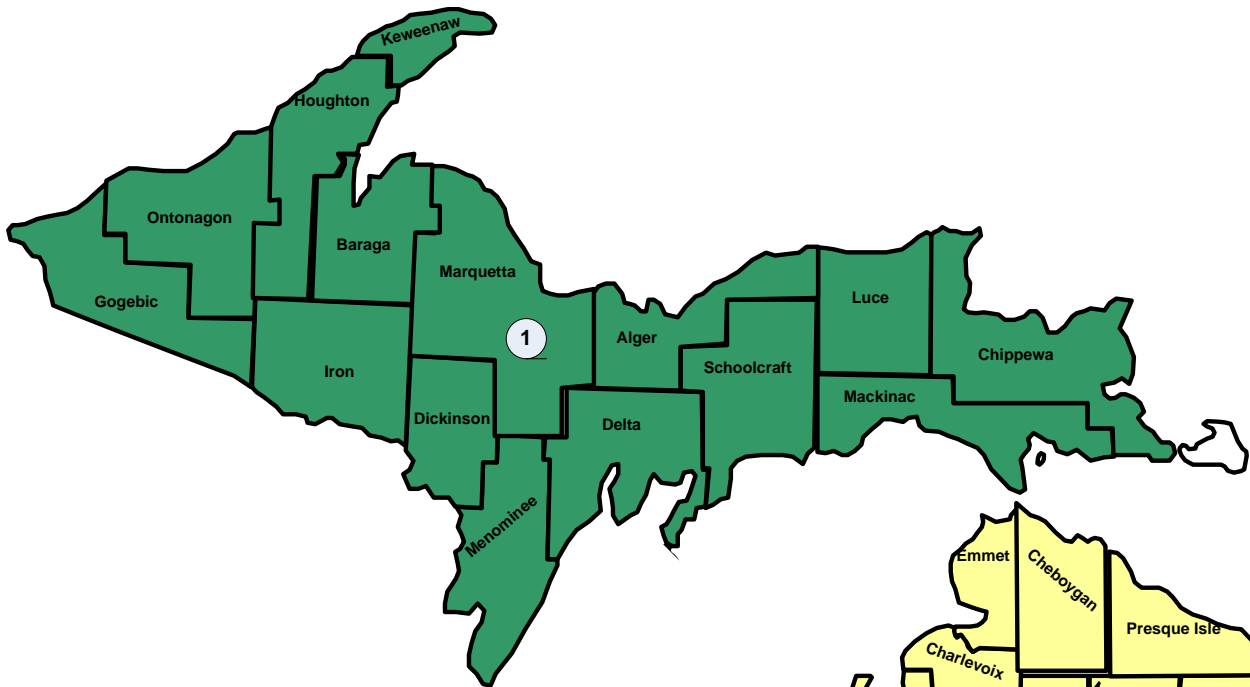


Campaign to End Homelessness Organizational Structure
