DATA COMMITTEE –

The Committee works to verify accurate input and provide support to agencies as needed. We monitor outcomes and outputs as it relates to grant requirements. This year we added reporting of financials to compare utilization with funds spent.

All this is brought to Steering Council to keep leadership informed and to provide support and follow up with any agencies as needed.

DATA: HOUSEHOLDS SERVED

- Total number of overall Households Served: **1,553**
- Average household size: **3 persons**

- Total Number of Single Households: **943**


- Total Number of Family Households: **610**
Of the **610** Family Households served, **1083** were adults and **1939** were children

- **61%** of Homeless individuals served were identified as African American

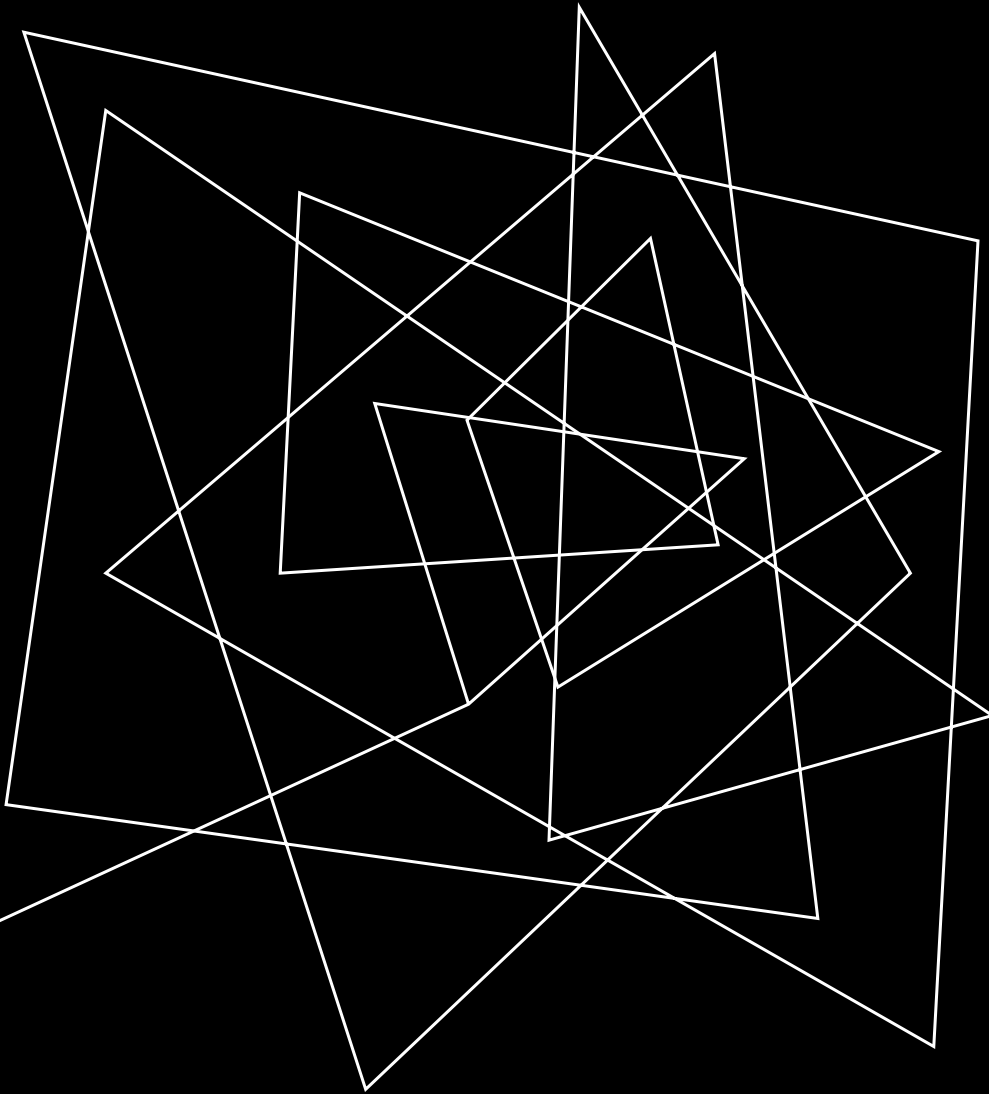
- **247** total households housed in the year of 2023 from the By-Name-List which typically have higher needs than others.

LSA

Longitudinal System Analysis

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- The LSA reporting period is from 10/1/22-9/30/2023. The 2022 LSA upload was reviewed prior to starting the 2023 LSA.
 - Last year there were warning flags presented that showed discrepancies in Bed Count pulled from HMIS compared to the 2022 HIC (Housing Inventory Count.) It was expected that these warning flags would pop up again this year.
 - Overall, the 2023 LSA is on track to be completed and as accurate as possible before the deadline of January 17th, 2024.
 - The CoC met with the assign Data Quality Liaison to take a deep dive on the warning flags that were presented regarding Bed and HIC count. The Liaison was able to provide us with a run down on what reports to reference to make it easier to conclude which bed counts were correct when compared to the HIC.
 - The CoC submitted its most recent report on 1/4/24 and the report was reviewed by the Data Quality Liaison on 1/9/24. The CoC is prepared to review the notes from the liaison and will submit one more report.

LSA CON'T



- The CoC's goal is to have a majority of the present warning flags reviewed and deemed as sufficient data before the deadline of January 17th, 2024. This would be a huge improvement compared to the 2022 LSA which was completed with only one warning flag having received a "sufficient note" explaining a discrepancy or having the LSA file accurately
- The CoC submitted its most recent report on 1/4/24 and the report was reviewed by the Data Quality Liaison on 1/9/24. The CoC is prepared to review the notes from the liaison and will submit one more report.

Steering Counsel Roster

January 10, 2024

- A. Up to three seats designated for persons with lived experience, elected by the Network Membership.
 - 1. Persons with lived experience must have experienced homelessness within the last seven years or are currently program participants.
 - 2. If multiple seats are held by persons with lived experience, at least one should be held by a person who came from an unsheltered situation.

- B. Seats designated for the following entities that are responsible for selecting their representative:
 - 1. Units of Government in Muskegon County that are HUD Participating Jurisdictions (PJs)
 - a. The City of Norton Shores/City of Muskegon
 - b. The City of Muskegon Heights
 - 2. The HARA (Housing Assessment and Resource Agency)
 - 3. The Muskegon County CMHSP (HealthWest)
 - 4. The Muskegon County DHHS Office
 - 5. The Network Collaborative Applicant

- C. Permanent non-voting seats assigned to the following positions:
 - 1. The Network Coordinator
 - 2. The Network HMIS Administrator

- D. Seven seats consisting of Network Members elected at the Annual Membership Meeting.

- E. Seats designated for the Chairperson of the following Network Committees:
 - 1. Coordinated Entry System Committee
 - 2. Nominating & Elections Committee
 - 3. Youth Action Board
 - 4. Review Committee
 - 5. Data Committee
 - 6. Outreach Committee

**Terms for elected seats on the Steering Council shall be for two years, staggered so that half are elected each year. The Voting Rules and Procedures shall be developed by the Nominating & Elections Committee and be reviewed each year by the Network Membership.
