The CoC approved a Re-Allocation process in September 2022 and updated it in March 2023. The Steering Council reviewed the process and informed the membership that all projects would be reviewed FINISH thought later The CoC had an extensive review of data, project outcomes and compliance with HUD and CoC standards as part of its Re-Allocation Process. The Review Committee held its meeting on July 18, 2023 and recommended that the project be eliminated with the Steering Council approving it on August 7, 2023. The grantee was notified on August 7, 2023 of the action.

The CoC approved a re-allocation process in September 2022 and updated it in March 2023. The re-allocation process reviewed project outcomes, spending, HMIS entries, successful placements, discharges into homelessness and other factors. All of the projects in the CoC were reviewed using the outcomes. As a result, the funding for the Veterans Single & Family Consolidated application was re-allocated from Bethany Housing to Community Mental Health of Muskegon County, dba Health West.
